Getting there

All four areas of Kettle Brook LNR can be accessed on foot at numerous points from the adjacent side roads, as detailed on the map over.

Lakeside is best accessed from Jowett, off Leyland Road. Stonydelph Lakes can be accessed by several roads off Fossdale Road, including Grindsbrook and Halton Lea.

Belgrave Lakes is best accessed from the small car park by the dance studio on Bird's Bush Road, off Wilnecote Lane.

The Direct Debit Guarantee

- The Guarantee is offered by all banks and building societies that accept instructions to pay Direct Debits
- If there are any changes to the amount, date or frequency of your Direct Debit Staffordshire Wildlife Trust (SWT) will notify you 10 working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit, by SWT or your bank or building society, you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society
- If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when SWT asks you to.
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required.

Something new each season



Spring

Watch the birds as they pair up and search for nesting sites. Keep an eye on the bird boxes to see which are occupied. Look out to see which water birds produce chicks first.



Summer

Green is the summer colour of the Nature Reserve, grass and trees providing every shade you can imagine. Look out for butterflies sunning themselves. Dragonflies and damselflies hover round the water's edge.



Autumn

Trees and bushes provide a colourful feast for birds and animals. The orchard is brimming with rosy apples. After this come all the colours of autumn in the carpet of leaves.



Winter

A couple of cold days and the frozen lakes make a skating rink for the water birds. In snow the paths give access to wonderful snowy vistas.



Managing for future generations

Kettle Brook was designated as a Local Nature Reserve (LNR) in 2004, ensuring its future as a haven for wildlife and people to enjoy.

The site is managed in partnership by Tamworth Borough Council and Staffordshire Wildlife Trust, as part of the Wild About Tamworth project. Watch the site change and evolve as we continue to manage it, with help from the local community.

Get involved

The Friends of the lakes help to manage and develop the Belgrave Lakes and Stonydelph Lakes area of the site. They are a group of local residents who meet regularly on the first Sunday of the month and are always looking for new members! All ages, abilities and skills welcomed!

The Wilnecote Wildlife Conservation Group help to manage the Wilnecote end of the LNR. They, too, are local residents who meet regularly on the last Saturday of the month and welcome the support new volunteers can offer.



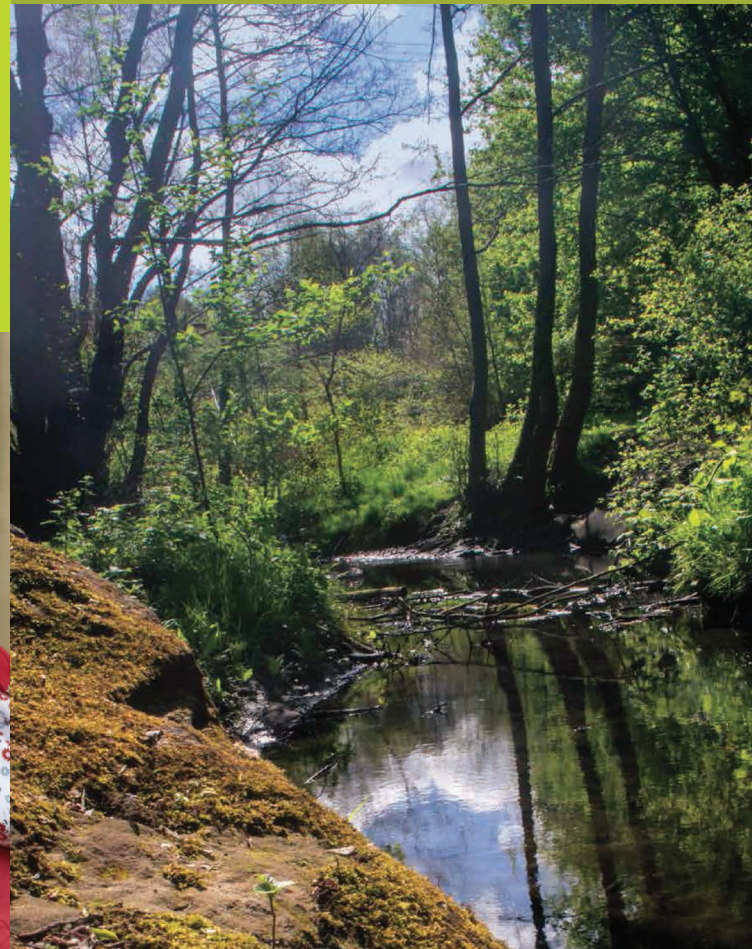
Join the Wild About Tamworth project

What to see and do

Kettle Brook is a place to escape and enjoy some peace and tranquillity. Whether you choose to follow the well-used route around the lakes or explore the woodland copses, you are sure to see and hear nature all around. Water birds are always present, with the seasonal excitement of chicks to watch. Look out for dragonflies and damselflies too. A rich tapestry of habitats including woodland, grassland and the lakes themselves makes this a special place. The outside gym offers a great place to exercise.

Wild flowers

These are best sought adjacent to the lakes where purple loosestrife and cuckoo flower can be seen. Many types of grasses can be seen across the wider site. Continued management of the site should increase numbers and diversity of species. Common species include meadow sweet and lesser celandine.



Trees

Kettle Brook is home to a variety of native trees. These include wet woodland species such as alder and crack willow, that unsurprisingly dominate wet areas. The numerous plantations include oak, hazel, silver birch, field maple and cherry. Birds such as blackcap and whitethroat are known to nest in the woodland.



History

Some of the land you see around you was once farm land with cattle grazing the site. There was also industry in the form of mining and clay works locally. Tamworth Borough Council purchased the site with the aim of providing a nature reserve for wildlife and local people to enjoy. You can still see signs of the past here as you journey through the reserve. There are remnants of hedgerows and trees now grow where pit spoil heaps once were.
