Seasonal highlights at
The Wolseley Centre

Spring

As the weather warms up, listen out for chiffchaffs, one of the first migrant songbirds to arrive in spring.

Wildflowers will also be blooming, such as bluebells, daffodils, primroses and toadflax. Snake's head fritillary, an unusual purple bell-like flower, can often be seen at the far end of Badger's Woodland.

Insects will also start to make an appearance. Hoverflies and honey bees can be seen in sheltered spots and the butterflies that hibernate in Britain over winter, such as brimstones and peacocks, will start foraging for nectar.

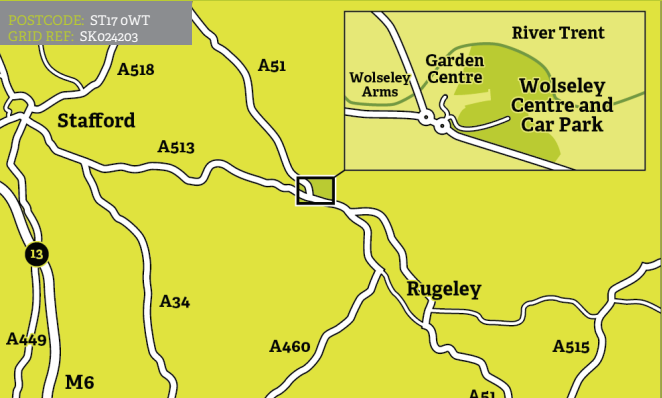


Summer

Spring butterflies will be joined by other species including green-veined white, speckled wood and comma, amongst many others, as well as migrants from Europe such as red admirals.

As the weather continues to get warmer, look for dragonflies and damselflies. Large red damselflies are usually one of the first to be seen. You should also be able to spot broad-bodied chasers in the wet meadow, banded demoiselles along the river and azure damselflies near the lakes.

Also look out for our resident kingfishers when you're near the river or lakes. Listening for a high pitch whistle can alert you to look for a blue bullet flying over the water.



Getting there:
The Wolseley Centre is on the A51 just north of Rugeley. Look for brown tourist signs with the badger on. At the double island turn into the garden centre entrance then immediately right for The Wolseley Centre. There is a large car park. A donation for car parking is much appreciated and will go towards Staffordshire Wildlife Trust's conservation work across the county.

Welcome to The Wolseley Centre

Staffordshire Wildlife Trust's HQ, the Wolseley Centre, is surrounded by 26 acres of wildlife-friendly grounds that are completely free to explore.

Perfect for a family outing or a relaxing wander surrounded by nature, the centre has something for all ages. Our network of accessible footpaths are ideal for everyone, including pushchairs, wheelchairs, and little feet, and we also welcome dogs on leads.

Nature lovers can wander around the different wildlife habitats. Look for the bright blue flash of kingfishers as you stroll alongside the river and colourful dragonflies darting across pools and lakeside edges.

Families can embark on a nature trail, or run, jump, climb and splash on the natural play features around the grounds.

Inside the visitor centre you'll find a gift shop selling homeware, toys, books, wildlife goods and cards. There are indoor and outdoor seating areas where you can enjoy cold drinks and snacks including sandwiches, plus hot drinks from our drinks machine.

VISITOR CENTRE OPENING TIMES: Summer: weekdays 9am - 5pm, weekends 10am - 5pm. Winter: weekdays 10am - 4pm, weekends 10am - 4pm. Opening times vary over Christmas holiday - see website or call beforehand.

Gift shop
A friendly and welcoming visitor centre and gift shop selling nature-inspired books, toys, homeware, clothing, cards, bird food and feeders. The centre also sells hot and cold drinks and cold snacks.



Conference centre
The Wolseley Centre is ideally equipped to host business meetings, training, team building, talks, presentations and product launches. There are two modern meeting rooms with flexible room layouts for up to 60 delegates.



Nature-themed activities
The Trust encourages children and visitors to discover the natural world through a variety of events. From bug hunting and pond-dipping to outdoor survival skills and nature-themed crafts, there is something for everyone.



Fun for families
Run, jump, climb and splash on a number of natural play features around the site or take part in a seasonal trail which is available from the visitor centre.



Natural sculptures
As you explore, look for the many sculptures and willow creations around the grounds and in the leafy undergrowth. Seek out the giant willow badger and our otter tree carving.

Wildlife habitats
The Wolseley Centre boasts a wonderful mixture of semi-natural woodland, wetland and species-rich grassland, that are used by a wide variety of wildlife including otters and an abundant population of bats.
