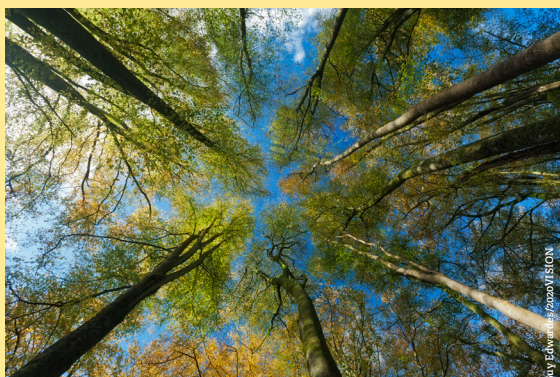

Wild About Tamworth

The Wild About Tamworth project started in 2003 with the aim of creating new Local Nature Reserves (LNRs) and improving existing reserves and wild spaces for both people and wildlife.

Volunteers are essential to the project and across Tamworth there are nine conservation groups helping to protect and improve the reserves by carrying out a variety of tasks from bench and bridge installations to creating other holts, planting new hedgerows and creating wildflower meadows.

Join your local conservation group today!

No previous experience is required and full instructions are given for all tasks. Tools, gloves, training and refreshments are provided. All you need is suitable clothing and footwear.

People of all ages and abilities can get involved, but under 18s need to be accompanied by an adult at all times.
