



Forest School is a holistic educational process that aims to raise self-awareness and self-esteem in an outdoor, nonclassroom environment. Children participate in small achievable tasks, connecting them with the environment and encouraging free exploration.

Sessions take place over a minimum of half a term, and are led by Staffordshire Wildlife Trust's

outcomes. Sessions can be tailored to all age

Forest School Practitioner, Level 3 £975
