

Encourage hedgehogs into your garden:

- **Go Wild!** Create a 'wild' area in your garden by planting wildflowers. This will encourage insects and slugs which hedgehogs love to eat.
- Leave food and fresh water (in a shallow dish) out to encourage spiky visitors.
- Leave the leaves! Don't tidy up fallen leaves as hedgehogs will use them to make cosy bedding.
- **Prickly pathways!** Cut a small hole (5" square) at the bottom of your fence/gravel board to allow hedgehogs to move freely between gardens.

Make a cosy winter home for hedgehogs:

- 1. Remove the lid and place the box upside down in a sheltered corner of your garden
- 2. Cut a hole in one end of the box to act as a door for your hedgehog
- 3. Cut a small ventilation hole in each side of the box
- 4. Line the floor inside the box with loose straw/ hay and lots of dry leaves/twigs (hedgehogs love this!)
- 5. Using the polythene/tarpaulin cover the box and secure around the base with stones/ pebbles
- 6. Cover the box with lots of dry leaves/twigs

What you'll need:

A sturdy plastic box

Straw/hay

Lots of dry leaves/twigs

Stones/pebbles

A sheet of tarpaulin/polythene
